

MLIS Degree Requirements (for all those admitted prior to Fall 2015)

Please note: These curricular requirements are part of the Program Transition phase from MLIS to MI. Below is the MLIS curriculum and the course requirements. Students who entered the program prior to Fall 2015 will receive an MLIS degree unless they choose MI. Students who entered in Fall 2015 will receive an MI degree and will follow the MLIS curriculum though they have an option to switch to the MI curriculum.

- Full time students: 36 credits are required. A maximum of 12 credits per semester is recommended.
- Part time students: 36 credits must be completed within a three-year period. A minimum of 6 credits per term is required unless special permission is obtained from the department Chair.

The table below itemizes the general required coursework. You will take at least **9 credits in lead courses** and a **minimum of 15 credits in a combination of lead and central courses** (ex: three leads and two centrals, four leads and one central, or five leads). You are also required to enroll in three zero credit classes.
